Bennett Village

- Assumed operations as a Not-For-Profit in 1999, located on the campus of Georgetown Hospital
- Only Not-For-Profit LTC Home in Halton Hills

VISION:

"To build an entire village designed for older adults where aging happens in an enriching, supportive and safe community setting".





A Critical Shortage of Long-Term Care (LTC) In Halton Region

- Bennett Centre's current waiting list is over 200 seniors (Oct. 20, 2021)
- Mississauga/Halton region has fewer beds per population aged 75+
- 30% lower than the provincial average
- Wait times can be up to two years
- More than 700 Francophone seniors in the GTA on waiting lists





Home of the New Bennett Centre Long-Term Care Home



A Centre of Excellence

- A centre of excellence and innovation in Halton Region
- Proposed three-storey 160-bed long-term care facility
 - community space
 - 96 private LTC beds
 - 64 basic LTC beds
 - Five 32-bed resident home units
 - Separate dining facilities in each resident home area
 - Social and Outdoor gardens
 - Multi-purpose space available to external organizations
 - Improved technology to provide quality of care and enhanced communications for residents, staff, family members and the community

Two New Specialized Units

- Secured specialized Behavioural Unit
- Francophone Unit with culturally-specific programming and services.
 Recognized as one of the largest Francophone units in south-western Ontario







Support Long-Term Care in Halton Hills

Bennett Centre requests the following:

- 1. Council to re-confirm its support of the Bennett Village redevelopment project;
- 2. Seek Council's permission to enable Halton Hills staff to work with Bennett Village staff on the redevelopment project;
- 3. Council to consider waiving the Bennett Village's development charges; and
- 4. Council to refer the Bennett Village redevelopment project to Halton Regional Council for support and consideration.
